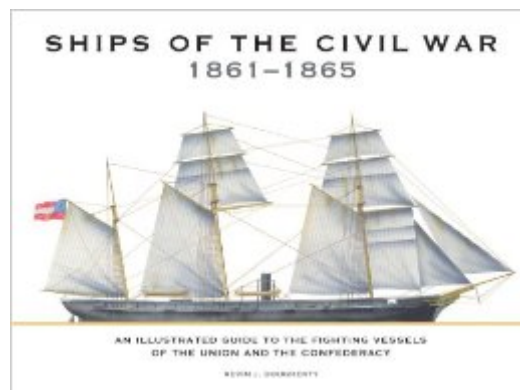

Ships Of The Civil War 1861-1865: An Illustrated Guide To The Fighting Vessels Of The Union And The Confederacy



Synopsis

The Civil war may be mainly remembered for its infamous land battles, such as Gettysburg, Manassas, and Shiloh, but its naval engagements announced a new kind of naval warfare, with the first-time use of ironclads, submarines, and torpedoes, and the introduction of newer and more powerful naval artillery. The conflict saw the use of paddle-driven river boats, steam warships, ram ships, sloops, cruisers, and the development of new ironclad ships such as low-lying monitors. Arranged by type of ship, *Ships of the Civil War* provides concise coverage of some of the most famous warships of the era, including: the seminal duel between the ironclads CSS Virginia and the USS Monitor, the Confederate raider Alabama's demise off the USS Kearsage; and one of the first successful actions by a submarine, when CSS Hunley exploded a mine beneath the Federal gunboat USS Housatonic. The book also includes blockade runners, such as A.D. Vance and Hope; raiders, such as CSS Sumter and USS Quaker City; and cruisers, like the CSS Tallahassee, which spectacularly raided northern waters, destroying dozens of Federal merchantmen in the process. "Ships of The Civil War 1861-1865: An Illustrated Guide To The Fighting Vessels Of The Union And The Confederacy" by Kevin J. Dougherty is an excellent resource for anyone interested in the fighting ships of both the Union and Confederate Navies during the Civil War. At 224 pages, the brief history of the vessels and outstanding illustrations of the ships tell the amazing stories of many of the famous and not so famous vessels that patrolled the coastlines, rivers, and open seas during the Civil War. Many of the ships in this book were overhauled and adapted to become fighting vessels. Included in the book are the Ironclads, Gunboats, Raiders, Cruisers, Blockade Runners, and Submarines. It was both the Union and Confederate Navies that helped "modernize" vessels and the world had to take notice. Such famous vessels and the CSS Merrimack and the USS Monitor are highlighted, including their famous battle, the Confederate Dreadnaught the CSS Abeldarle which became the victim of what some consider the "first Navy Commando/SEAL" Lt. William Cushing who with a 12 man crew sunk her. Other brief histories are about the Blockade Runners (invaluable assistance in bringing supplies to the Confederacy), gunboats (which helped secure the Mississippi River for the Union), sailing "man of wars" including the CSS Alabama, and other great vessels of the time. The illustrations of the vessels are truly excellent and enhance the reading of the history of the vessels. A brief but fascinating read in the beginning give the historical overview of the naval war between the Union and the Confederacy and the strategies used by the navies is provided.
