

Mr. Otott weaves in personal narratives with the regimental actions in a vivid, fascinating and descriptive read. The actions of the morning of September 17, 1862 of Hood's Brigade was at times confusing when they first entered the battle near Dunkard's

Church, the woods surrounding the church, and the cornfield where the First Texas Infantry in a matter of an hour suffered 82.3% casualty rate.
